UNIVERSITY OF NORTH TEXAS

The University of North Texas is a four-year public R1: Doctoral University – Highest research activity (for an institution to have this Carnegie Classification, they must award at least 20 research/scholarship doctoral degrees). The institution was founded in 1890 as a normal and teacher-training institute. Its name changed from North Texas State University in 1988. UNT is located in Denton, a city of approximately 169,843, and in the Dallas/Fort Worth/Arlington area of over 8.5 million. The university is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral degrees. UNT is one of the 5 largest universities in Texas and among the 40 largest in the United States.
